Be Prepared

Please be sure to carefully read all the rules for the Division you will be exhibiting in as well as the Schedule of classes. Pre-reading the Schedule will help you fill out your show entry tags with a minimum of confusion.

Return address labels make filling out the 2-part tags much simpler, consider bringing 2 times the number of entries you will have.

It is best to research and classify your lily entries before bringing them to show. The internet is a great resource for either taking pictures or searching for a name. This will allow more time for preparation and the best presentation of your lilies.

General Rules and Information

- 1. Entries will be accepted and lilies may be prepared on Saturday morning, June 24, 2023 from 6:30 am 9:30 am.
- 2. Entries close at 9:30 am and the Judges Meeting begins at 9:30 am. Judging will begin at 10:00 am.
- 3. Any lily grower may enter stems in the show. If a major award is won by a person who is not a member of IRLS, a one-year membership and 5 lily bulbs will be given instead of a perpetual award.
- 4. Each exhibitor is responsible for placing his/her stems in separate stem holders, attaching a completed entry tag, and placing entry on the classification table. The Classification Committee will assist exhibitors, if needed, in naming lilies and determining the class in which they should be entered.
- 5. The Classification Committee has the right to reassign entries which have been incorrectly entered. The Classification Committee will place all valid exhibits on the show tables. If a misclassification is found after judging has begun, it may be moved to the appropriate class upon agreement of all judges involved.
- 6. Entries are the property of the exhibitor. Anthers and pollen may be removed only by the exhibitor or with his/her written consent.
- 7. All entries are to remain in place until the show closes at 4 pm.
- 8. The decision of the Show Chair will be final regarding any disagreement about the interpretation of these show rules, or any matter not covered by them.

Judging Rules

- 1. The official North American Lily Society scale of points will be used to evaluate exhibits in competitive horticulture classes.
- 2. Only exhibits receiving blue ribbons (1sts) will be eligible for special awards except for "Evans Highest Bud Count" which may be chosen from all accepted entries awarded a ribbon.
- 3. The "Best in Show" award winner must score 90 points by the Official NALS Scale. It may be a part of a multiple stem exhibit (Section F) scoring 90 or more points.
- 4. Only accredited judges are to select the "Best in Show" award, but all those judging the show may be present during this selection.
- 5. In judging Section F (3 stems of a clone, strain, or species), each individual stem must score 90 or more points for the collection to win 1st place.
- 6. Judges should not judge classes in which they have exhibits.
- 7. Any exhibit of unusual merit, not provided for in the schedule, may be given special commendation, if the judges so desire.
- 8. A decision by the judges is final and may be changed only if all judges concerned are present, preferably before the show opens to the public.
- 9. A novice is a person who has never won a blue ribbon at a lily show.

Horticulture Rules

- 1. Only true lilies (genus lilium) may be entered.
- 2. All lilies exhibited in competition must have been grown outdoors without protection and under the supervision of the exhibitor.
- 3. Exhibitors may enter more than one entry in a class, providing that each entry is a different cultivar, except in those classes consisting of only one cultivar.
- 4. Entries with major abnormalities or unopened flowers will be set aside and not judged.
- 5. Anthers may be removed, but it is preferable to leave them on. When competing stems are otherwise equal in quality, removal of anthers would require some penalty in scoring. Exception: hybridizers will not be penalized for removing pollen from specimens of seedlings they enter in Section D.

Section C. Single stems of unnamed hybrid seedlings <u>not hybridized</u> by the exhibitor. Each seedling constitutes a separate class.

Class 33. All Divisions Seedlings <u>not hybridized</u> by exhibitor

Section D. Single stems of unnamed hybrid seedlings <u>hybridized and grown</u> from seed by the exhibitor. Each seedling constitutes a separate class.

Class 34. All Divisions Seedlings <u>hybridized and grown</u> by exhibitor Section E. Single stem entries of a <u>specie or natural variant</u>. Each species constitutes a separate class.

Class 35. Species or its natural variant.

Section F. Three (3) stems of any named hybrid clone, strain, or species.

Class 36. Three (3) stems of any named hybrid clone, strain, or

species.

Section G. Collection of three (3) Asiatic Hybrids with different orientations; each stem identified with cultivar name. One stem from each Division Ia, Ib, and Ic.

Class 37. Three (3) Asiatic Hybrid stems with different

orientations

Section H. Lilies grown in containers <u>without protection</u>. Single pots. Separate classes will be established for each cultivar or species.

Class 38. Single stem/bulb pure pot.

Class 39. Three (3) stems/bulbs of a single cultivar per pot. Section I. *Juniors up to age 16.* Single lily stem. Exhibitor may enter more than one (1) stem as long as each is a different cultivar.

Class 40. Single stem of any cultivar. Section J. All educational displays. To be judged by Design Judges.

Class 41. Educational exhibit.

Artistic Design Rules

- 1. Designs must be in place by 9:30 am Saturday June 24, 2023. Judging begins at 10 am.
- 2. Space for all exhibits in all classes may not exceed 24 inches in width or depth.
- 3. Exhibitors may make only one (1) entry in a class.
- 4. A lily or lilies must be in all exhibits.
- 5. Designer's choice of other plant material (fresh or dried) may be used in the design unless other- wise noted.
- 6. Accessories, backgrounds, and/or niches may be used in all classes unless otherwise noted.
- 7. No artificial flowers or foliage may be used.
- 8. No Iowa Conservation Noxious Weeds may be used.
- 9. Judging will be by the Standard System. Judges' decisions are final.
- 10. *The Handbook for Flower Shows, 2017 Revision* with updates, will be the reference for judging designs by National Garden Clubs' Flower Show Judges.
- 11. The property of the exhibitor should be inconspicuously marked with the owner's name and address. All reasonable care will be taken, but the Show Committee will not be responsible for loss.

Photography Rules

- 1. Limit of two (2) photos per class per exhibitor.
- 2. Photos must have been taken by the exhibitor.
- 3. All photos must prominently feature "true" lilies (genus lilium).
- 4. Photos cannot have been entered in a previous IRLS Photography Division.
- 5. Judging will be by ballots cast by Lily Show visitors.
- 6. All photos must be 8"x10" or 8.5"X11" and must be mounted on 1/8" to ¼" thick cardboard, poster board, or foam board the same as the photo. IRLS will provide holders.
- 7. All photos <u>must</u> contain the following <u>printed</u> information: name, address, phone number, email (optional) and name of lily (if known). *See page 8*.
- 8. Photos must be picked up at the end of the show. Photos not picked up will become the property of the Iowa Regional Lily Society, unless other arrangements have been made.

Never Shown Lilies Before?

Many people are unsure of what to bring to the first show or two when they show lilies in the Horticultural Division. These handy items are the basic essentials you may need to prepare your lily stems for showing.

- Small sharp scissors
- Soft artists paint brushes
- Ink pens and pencils
- Exacto knife
- Rhubarb or celery stems

- Nippers to trim stems
- Q-tips
- Make-up removing sponges
- Lilies
- Return address labels

The IRLS will provide stem holders and entry cards for each exhibit entered.

There are usually lots of people around who will help you if you are unsure how to "groom" your lilies. Bring lots of stems and you will be amazed at how beautiful they look when displayed with all the others.
